We will, we've budgeted 285,000 public utilities

00:06:16 Speaker 4

I know you guys can read, so there's no sense in me going line item for line item.

If you do have a question about one, I'll be glad to back up and go over it.

Public utilities, of course, they come in from the state, so they hold pretty steady every year as well.

Prior year property taxes, of course, is in that section of the budget.

Our business taxes have went down just a tad.

00:06:45 Speaker 4

based on who comes and goes.

00:06:48 Speaker 4

Business.

00:06:48 Speaker 6

Could you say that again?

00:06:49 Speaker 6

I couldn't give you.

00:06:49 Speaker 6

It's based on what?

00:06:52 Speaker 4

Business taxes based on the businesses that come and go throughout the city.

No, business is coming and going.

00:06:57 Speaker 6

Okay.

00:06:58 Speaker 4

Business license, I mean business building license is all depending on who pulls a permit, growth, that type of thing.

We'll go to inter-local government.

00:07:12 Speaker 4

Our Robertson County fire revenue, to our knowledge, will stay the same based on the numbers that we've received from the county.

State and local sales tax is pulled from the number of residents that we have.

So those numbers are pre-calculated based on our citizens.

I've added in the fire grant that we have applied for, the park grant that we've applied for.

Is there any questions on page one?

00:07:57 Speaker 6

Which park grant is that, Kelly, please.

The \$240,000 will be the one that we applied for \$300,000, which is the walking trail.

On page two.

00:08:17 Speaker 8

I have a quick question.

00:08:18 Speaker 4

Sure.

00:08:18 Speaker 8

Why are property tax revenues going down?

00:08:21 Speaker 4

Because they're really not going down.

00:08:24 Speaker 4

We do not budget.

00:08:27 Speaker 4

So when we get our property tax estimates, we do not budget the entire amount because we know that 100% of them are not going to be paid.

So we are conservative when we budget those numbers.

00:08:42 Speaker 4

Page 2, we did, I did, because interest rates have changed, the interest earned has dropped some.

That is about the only number that fluctuated on page 2.

00:09:05 Speaker 4

We'll go to page 3, which is general government.

00:09:11 Speaker 4

There is not a lot of change in the general government under Mayor and Alderman.

Those numbers stay pretty steady.

00:09:21 Speaker 4

Under the recorder's office, there's not a lot of change there.

00:09:25 Speaker 4

In this budget, I have, based on last year's budget, there is a 5% pay increase included in this budget.

Will that be across the board one?

00:09:36 Speaker 4

Yes, that's across.

00:09:37 Speaker 4

across the board.

00:09:38 Speaker 6

How much was that?

00:09:39 Speaker 4

Five percent.

00:09:41 Speaker 4

On page four, under employer contributions, you'll notice that the hospital and health insurance has gone up.

That's based on Amber will need health insurance possibly this year, and the additional fireman that was budgeted

is also, that's based on if we hire a full-time firefighter and he needs insurance, that's included in that line item.

On page five.

Could you go just a little bit slower?

00:10:19 Speaker 6

Sure.

00:10:20 Speaker 6

Thanks.

00:10:21 Speaker 4

On page five, professional services, Mr.

00:10:25 Speaker 4

Neely addressed this line item.

00:10:28 Speaker 4

It does not state Robertson County Police Department, I mean, Robertson County Sheriff's Department.

00:10:33 Speaker 4

It's kind of like if we were paying

00:10:37 Speaker 4

Lowe's, I don't state the company that we're paying in every line item.

00:10:44 Speaker 4

So it's for professional services.

00:10:47 Speaker 4

And it was when we originally took out that contract, that was called the South Precinct.

00:10:52 Speaker 4

That's how come it's referenced in the budget that way.

00:10:55 Speaker 4

So it's not intentionally that it's not named Robertson County Sheriff's Department.

It's just that we don't name it depending on the vendor that we're paying.

It's just professional services.

00:11:05 Speaker 4

Just like if we were paying Russell, we don't name it Russell Freeman or Freeman and Bracey.

It's under professional services.

00:11:14 Speaker 6

What line item was that, Kelly?

00:11:17 Speaker 4

Page five.

00:11:18 Speaker 6

That would help.

00:11:21 Speaker 6

Oh, right.

00:11:22 Speaker 6

Yep.

00:11:23 Speaker 6

Okay.

00:11:26 Speaker 4

Page six.

00:11:30 Speaker 4

Fire department.

00:11:33 Speaker 4

Salaries do include that additional fireman if you guys so choose to hire the full-time fireman.

And that's the money the county's allocated for us to hire another one, correct?

00:11:45 Speaker 8

No.

00:11:45 Speaker 4

No, no, that's-- We did.

00:11:47 Speaker 8

Okay, no, good.

00:11:48 Speaker 8

I think I remember, I just, I was making sure.

Yes, we're still doing the per call right now, so right, as a-- We're not doing anything.

We haven't implemented anything.

The last time we voted was like \$20 per call if the volunteer went out, correct?

Yes.

Okay.

Under capital outlay, the grant that you guys approved is also added into their budget.

And which one is that?

The same one.

Under fire.

00:12:22 Speaker 6

Yeah.

00:12:22 Speaker 3

I do have one question there, if you would.

What are the legal and professional services for \$29,900?

00:12:32 Speaker 4

We pay Robertson County for the fees whenever we have a call that comes in.

00:12:39 Speaker 4

We have to pay them a service for those 911 services.

00:12:42 Speaker 3

Okay, that's where the legal and other professional services.

00:12:45 Speaker 4

Correct.

00:12:46 Speaker 4

Same type of situation as South Precinct.

00:12:55 Speaker 4

Under streets,

00:12:59 Speaker 4

There's not a lot of difference there, other than we do hope to be finished with the Shedden Road Bridge by the time we get to the next budget.

Sometimes.

00:13:11 Speaker 4

Yep.

00:13:12 Speaker 6

What's left to be done on that?

00:13:14 Speaker 4

On page.

00:13:16 Speaker 1

We have just some minor issues, primarily the right of property, getting it back to where it was supposed to be.

And that's what we're in discussion now with.

What we grew.

00:13:36 Speaker 4

On page 7, Parks and Recreation.

00:13:51 Speaker 4

There is not a lot of change there other than the revenue that was on page one is offsetting the expense on page one.

If you notice under the capital under grants, that is the expense for that revenue that will be coming in.

00:14:12 Speaker 3

What about the monies for the July 3rd event?

00:14:17 Speaker 3

Where are they included?

00:14:19 Speaker 4

Good question.

00:14:24 Speaker 4

How much do you think that will cost?

00:14:28 Speaker 3

We're probably going to be in the neighborhood of 15, I would think.

00:14:34 Speaker 3

and we approve what, 10,000 for fireworks themselves?

00:14:39 Speaker 1

Part of that has already been the.

00:14:41 Speaker 4

Expense in this year's budget.

00:14:43 Speaker 1

I think half of it has gone through this year.

00:14:53 Speaker 4

So that will be it.

00:14:55 Speaker 4

That will be an expense that you will need to discuss and add for the second reading.

00:15:00 Speaker 4

So when you do a second reading, that amount of money will need to be.

00:15:04 Speaker 4

We'll need to change that before we get to second reading.

Let's see.

00:15:11 Speaker 4

So that concludes the general fund budget.

Do we have the codification of the municipal code budgeted for this year?

00:15:25 Speaker 6

Would you be sending it in to be done again?

00:15:29 Speaker 6

It's not been done in three or four years.

00:15:32 Speaker 6

The municipal code, all the changes.

00:15:37 Speaker 4

No.

00:15:40 Speaker 4

Can we talk about that after we're done with the budget?

00:15:41 Speaker 4

Because this is just for the budget.

00:15:44 Speaker 6

Well, it should be in the budget.

00:15:47 Speaker 4

Well, are you talking about budget?

00:15:50 Speaker 4

Do we have it allotted for the budget?

00:15:52 Speaker 6

Yes.

00:15:53 Speaker 4

Well,

00:15:55 Speaker 4

Yeah, you can do guys to discuss doing that.

00:15:57 Speaker 4

But that's one of those things that I called and talked to them about that when you brought it up before.

00:16:04 Speaker 4

And they don't recommend doing it every year.

00:16:06 Speaker 6

Well, we certainly haven't.

00:16:08 Speaker 4

No, no, we haven't.

00:16:09 Speaker 4

But when you go back and look and I can find my numbers, I don't have them because I was working on budget, but

Not every ordinance that we pass goes in the city code.

00:16:20 Speaker 4

So when I went back and looked, we only have like between one and four ordinances a year that would even be updated.

00:16:30 Speaker 4

So, and some of them have already been updated a second time, so the original ordinance would not even be one that they would consider.

00:16:40 Speaker 4

So it doesn't benefit the city to send that information, but about every three to five years.

00:16:47 Speaker 4

And if I go back, when I went back and looked, I think we had eight ordinances that could possibly even be considered for update.

So it's not something that would be worth using the city's money every three years to update.

00:17:07 Speaker 4

Unless, I mean, it's just something that you guys want to consider.

00:17:09 Speaker 6

Wouldn't the building code be appropriate to have that sent in?

00:17:14 Speaker 4

I start to say, at this point, you could update for the building code probably.

00:17:18 Speaker 4

But up until then, the building code would probably be the first thing that would have been.

00:17:23 Speaker 4

All right.

00:17:23 Speaker 6

I'll talk to you about it later.

00:17:29 Speaker 4

Okay.

00:17:29 Speaker 4

State Street 8, we're on page 8.

00:17:39 Speaker 4

So there's not much change at all in State Street Aid's budget.

00:17:44 Speaker 4

Actually, I'm not sure there's any change.

00:17:51 Speaker 4

It's pretty basic.

00:17:52 Speaker 4

Page 9 is a blank page.

00:17:55 Speaker 4

Has to be, the line items just have to be adjusted.

00:18:00 Speaker 4

That will be corrected.

00:18:01 Speaker 4

Page 10 is drug fund.

00:18:06 Speaker 4

We've not received any funds from the county.

00:18:11 Speaker 4

So that is a zero in, zero out this year.

00:18:16 Speaker 4

Now we're to sewer, page 11.

00:18:23 Speaker 4

Page 11, sewer sales, they're just pretty much what they are.

00:18:30 Speaker 4

They're based on usage and usage flows up and down.

00:18:34 Speaker 4

So we've just estimated based on what we've proposed based on our estimated from last year and taken into consideration that not everybody pays on time.

00:18:47 Speaker 4

The interest earned, we have dropped that a little bit based on our interest rates.

00:18:54 Speaker 4

And that's pretty much all the revenue that we bring in, other than every once in a while if somebody pulls a sewer tap fee.

00:19:05 Speaker 3

The increase for the that we did for the per foot be on this somewhere.

00:19:12 Speaker 3

I mean, in the gas, it'll be on the next.

00:19:21 Speaker 4

And then page 12.

00:19:35 Speaker 4

Let me see, I have a note here.

00:19:41 Speaker 4

The one thing I do need to note is that you guys, the draft that I sent you guys out last week, I mentioned that I had updated it at 5 o'clock this afternoon trying to go over it because I was trying to give you guys something to look at before I left last week.

00:19:57 Speaker 4

There were a few changes from the one that you had last week to today's

00:20:01 Speaker 4

And one of the things is that the 5% pay increase, there was a couple of employees that 5% pay increase did not hit.

00:20:09 Speaker 4

And so you'll notice the line items that changed were the recorder's office gas and sewer because Amber's did not hit, Caleb's didn't hit, and Brandon's didn't hit.

00:20:19 Speaker 6

What does that mean?

00:20:21 Speaker 6

It didn't hit.

00:20:21 Speaker 4

It means the calculation didn't hit.

00:20:24 Speaker 4

Whenever I went to calculate, it didn't hit those line items.

00:20:27 Speaker 6

Okay.

00:20:28 Speaker 4

So if you notice that if you try to do line item for line item, you're going to notice that those did not, will not match.

00:20:34 Speaker 4

And also the depreciation on sewer and gas, I also updated today because I had requested the depreciation schedule and from our auditors and she sent that today.

00:20:47 Speaker 4

So I have those numbers.

00:20:50 Speaker 4

So in the sewer department,

00:20:56 Speaker 4

We're pretty much basic.

00:20:57 Speaker 4

We run pretty much the same budget year after year after year, other than if we have something to tear up or break down or we have a major capital outlay expense.

00:21:10 Speaker 4

Our ARPA

00:21:12 Speaker 4

is about to come to a close, so we will try to finish that out here in probably the next nine months.

00:21:18 Speaker 4

There will be probably a little money that will roll over from June until the next fiscal year.

00:21:24 Speaker 4

We're not sure what those numbers are now.

00:21:25 Speaker 4

They're trying to finish out our I&I project to give us those calculations.

00:21:31 Speaker 6

Kelly, when will the -- we were going to be getting lower rates on purchasing gas, weren't we?

00:21:40 Speaker 4

They're a month-to-month rate, so it just depends on what the market is.

00:21:44 Speaker 6

Oh, okay.

00:21:45 Speaker 4

Yeah.

00:21:47 Speaker 4

So on page 13, the repair and maintenance, this year's repair and maintenance is up because we just had a lot of things that had, that something happened and they just went squirrely.

00:22:04 Speaker 4

But this next year, you'll notice that the proposed

00:22:07 Speaker 4

amount for repair and maintenance is also up, but that includes the purchase of supplies that you all voted on recently to buy.

And then I mentioned that the allowance for depreciation, that I updated that, was a change from the budget, I mean the, yeah, the budget that you all had.

00:22:32 Speaker 4

So that is all of sewer.

00:22:34 Speaker 4

We'll go to page 15.

00:22:41 Speaker 4

Gas sales are hard to budget.

00:22:45 Speaker 4

I always underestimate gas sales because we never know if we're going to have a warm or a cold season.

00:22:52 Speaker 4

You never know what weather's going to do around here.

00:22:55 Speaker 4

Could have a nice storm, never know.

00:22:57 Speaker 4

So

00:22:59 Speaker 4

You'll notice that this year looks like it's estimated higher than next year, and that's the reason, because I don't estimate we're going to have an ice storm two years in a row.

00:23:10 Speaker 4

Yeah, right.

00:23:12 Speaker 4

So if you go to page 16, you will see that salaries for line item 111, which is the first on the page,

00:23:29 Speaker 4

have been reduced.

00:23:30 Speaker 4

That is because we have split -- Brian, he's been paid 100 percent from gas.

00:23:38 Speaker 4

He will be paid 50 percent in gas and 50 percent in sewer because he's the utility manager of both departments.

00:23:45 Speaker 4

So we've spread his salary.

00:23:49 Speaker 4

When you get to health insurance, health insurance has gone up.

00:23:56 Speaker 4

Jeanette's husband may, more likely than not, need health insurance this year.

00:24:03 Speaker 4

So that will be an added expense.

00:24:06 Speaker 4

And Brian's wife will possibly need to add health insurance as well.

00:24:13 Speaker 4

And that is the only changes, I think, to the gas budget there.

00:24:23 Speaker 4

Source of supply is the same as the revenues.

00:24:26 Speaker 4

They're balanced based on how much gas sales you have, and you just don't know where the rates would be.

00:24:33 Speaker 4

So we are still -- gas and sewer are still being worked on, and they will be probably for the next month, trying to see what expenses we still have for the next month.

00:24:50 Speaker 4

So it'll be a better estimate on your second -- when you get ready for second reading than it is right now.

But is there any questions?

00:25:02 Speaker 8

Was there with what's been going on in the Middle East?

00:25:05 Speaker 8

Was there an uptick in natural gas prices?

00:25:07 Speaker 4

I haven't got the first of the month.

00:25:09 Speaker 4

Yeah, I'm kind of curious to see what the rates are.

00:25:32 Speaker 3

I need to add some stuff to the project or do we need to vote on for the fire department or?
